I eat cookies.

I eat them.

I ate cookies.

I ate them.

(*tu*) You cook (*cucinare*) the pasta.

You cook it.

You cooked the pasta.

You cooked it.

He buys melon.

He buys it.

He bought melon.

He bought it.

You (formal) prepare (*preparare*) eggs.

You prepare them.

You prepared eggs.

You prepared them.

We finish the seafood.

We finish it (them).

We finished the seafood.

We finished it (them).

(*voi*) You wash the table.

You wash it.

You washed the table.

You washed it.

They look for the bakery.

They look for it.

They looked for the bakery.

They looked for it.

I drink (*bere*) coffee every day.

I drink it every day.

I drank coffee every day.

I drank it every day.

Do you know (*conoscere*) this pastry store?

(Do) you know it?

She finds (*trovare*) the butter. She finds it. She found the butter. She found it.
