

## 2016 College of Charleston ANTH493 Field School in Archaeology: Excavations at Dixie Plantation 4 Credits May 16<sup>th</sup> - May 31<sup>st</sup>

Meeting Mon – Sat 7am – 4:30pm

This summer the Anthropology Program at the College of Charleston will offer credit for participation in an archaeological research project at Dixie Plantation. This property has a long occupational history (both historic and prehistoric). Focus this summer will be on the early colonial occupation of the site (1700-1750). This project is co-directed by Dr. and Dr. Kim Pyszka (Auburn University at

Maureen Hays (College of Charleston) Montgomery).

The course is intended to introduce the student to field archaeology. Students will be given the opportunity to apply what they have learned in the classroom to field situations. Aspects of archaeological survey, testing, and excavation will be addressed. Proper mapping and cataloging techniques will also be taught. Students will also gain expertise in basic lab techniques and artifact processing.

Students should be in reasonably good physical condition and be able to work nine hour days six days a week. Daily attendance is mandatory and it is strongly recommended that students do not work another job during the field school.

This course fulfills the Anthropology major Research Methods requirement and the Capstone requirement for the Archaeology major/minor.

Prerequisite: ANTH202 or permission of the instructor.
