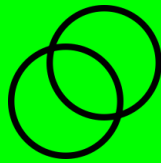


Interview with Mr. Beddows

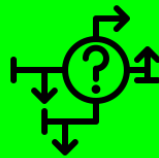
1. When you moved to New York was there any differences compared to Britain?

Mr. Beddows answer: Yeah there was a big difference because I grew up in a small town in England I didn't grow up in a big city. The big difference was number of people and my parents are afraid how many people were live in London, because I didn't live in any big city I lived in a small city, maybe sixty thousands people. At Dwight I was just in general trying to make everybody happy but it is very difficult as well.
