## Children who read succeed



Reading is like a puzzle with three main pieces: **decoding**, **fluency** and **comprehension**. If any one piece of this puzzle is missing, your child's ability to read will suffer.

## Here's how you can help!!

- Read for pleasure yourself. This way you can serve as a role model.
- Read anything and everything with your child; books, signs, posters, cereal boxes, papers, internet sites—if you can read it, read it with your child!
- Read to your child.
- Have your child read to you.
- Make sure your child has access to plenty of reading material.
- Let your child read books in his/her native language. (Reading skills are transferable from one language to another!)
- Let your child read books at his/her own level. Your child will not understand books that are too difficult. This will become frustrating and make reading a negative experience. Successfully decoding (saying the words correctly) does not mean the book is at the right level! They must be able to <u>understand</u> the work!
- Finally, READ, READ, READ!!!

## When your child is reading to you, here are some tips to help his/her skills develop in each of the following areas.
