In the current school year, over 67% of Cottage Lane is enrolled in the Instrumental Music Program.

Q: **"What instruments are taught in our music program?"**

A: Group instruction on all string instruments (violin, viola, cello and bass) are offered. Wind instruction is given on the flute, oboe, clarinet and alto sax. The Brass instruments include trumpet, French Horn, trombone and for students interested in learning the tuba, the first two years are usually spent on the baritone horn.

Q: **"What are the hardest instruments to learn?"**

A: Each instrument has its' own set of challenges. All instruments require patience in the very beginning and a commitment to practice on a regular basis. As yet, no one has figured out a way for immediate gratification in learning to play a musical instrument but most children find individual success and accomplishment with a moderate amount of individual work at home.

Q: **"What are the most popular instruments to study?"**

A: Actually there is a great deal of interest in all of the instruments. We ask that all those considering percussion as a choice think carefully about alternatives, as there is limited performing opportunity for this instrument by the very nature of its' role within the musical organization. In general, there is always room for most instruments but from experience, ***we have found that when the number exceeds more than a few percussionists in an ensemble, those students may lose interest because the role played by the percussion is***

We are very happy to inform you that your child will have the opportunity to enroll in the Instrumental Music Program at Cottage Lane Elementary School. This program is offered to all incoming students. It's an excellent opportunity to enrich your child not only musically but as many recent studies have shown, a way to develop and enhance analytical, organizational and problem solving skills which will benefit them throughout their lives (Please see the SAT score chart in the center section). Beginning in the fall, all of the students will receive one group lesson each week. After mastery of the basic skills have been achieved, the students will also receive one ensemble rehearsal each week.
