¹ I counted donations as relevant to this race if they were made between January 1, 2008 (first year for which data is available from the Board of Elections website) and November 30, 2009.

² I counted donations as relevant to this race if they were made between April 14, 2015 and January 4, 2016. No donations were made between 2012 and April 14, 2015; no donations have been made since January 4, 2016.

³ I counted donations as relevant to this race if they were made between October 6, 2016, the date of Ken Thompson's death, and November 30, 2017.

⁴ I counted donations as relevant to this race if they were made between January 1, 2014 (after the last Manhattan DA race) and before November 30, 2017.

⁵ I counted observations as belonging to the same individual if they matched on first name, middle name if provided, last name (or group name) and zip code. This technique may result in both undercounting of individuals (if two John Q. Smiths live in the same zip code) and over-counting (if John Q. Smith moves to a new zip code during the election). After comparing the results of this counting procedure with the underlying data, I believe it is more likely to over-count the number of individuals than undercount them.

⁶ Cyrus Vance contributed to his own campaign 45 times. One of his contributions was the largest made to his own campaign, \$100,000.

⁷ No individual contributed to a campaign more than twice.

⁸ Ama Dwimoh contributed to her own campaign at least 109 times; Anne J Swern contributed to her own campaign at least 92 times; and Marc Fliedman contributed to his campaign at least 43 times.

⁹ MacAndrews & Forbes Group, LLC contributed the most often to the Cyrus Vance campaign, at 8 times. Two of their donations were among the largest made in the campaign, each \$10,000. (One of these two was made under the name Mafco Consolidated Group, NYC).

¹¹ Largest donation was from Kasowitz, Benson, Torres & Friedman to Snyder for DA. Note that they donate an additional \$72,000 to Snyder for DA at other points.
