April 12 - The Shop On Main Street Movie Viewing

Tom Slater (English Dept.) will present and conduct a Q & A on the movie, *The Shop On Main Street*, about the Holocaust in Slovakia. The film won the 1965 Oscar for Best Foreign Language Film.

April 13 - Past and Present Implications of the Holocaust: Moshe Baran Holocaust Survivor and Martin Dean Holocaust Researcher

Moshe Baran will tell his life story during the Holocaust from forced laborer to partisan fighter. It is an inspirational story of survival and resistance, with a focus on what people can do to create a more peaceful world. Also, Martin Dean, a United States Holocaust Memorial Museum researcher, will discuss current research. Both speakers will discuss past and current implications of the Holocaust, and the crucial need for Holocaust research and education.

April 15 - Panel: Past and Present Genocides

An interdisciplinary panel of IUP faculty and invited guests will discuss genocides and responses to them.
