The Frick Laboratory studies how sex-steroid hormones, aging, and environmental factors affect hippocampal function and hippocampal-dependent memory. The lab's goal is to identify how these factors affect the cellular and molecular mechanisms underlying memory formation. Undergraduates play a vital role in the research process, aiding graduate students and post-doctoral researchers with their projects, and even working on independent projects.
