Brief Description of Research Project	This proposal will investigate the air pollution and health equity impacts of an ongoing transportation planning program in the Tampa area, Tampa Bay Next. Two aspects will be integrated. First, we will estimate the changes in pollutant emissions, concentrations, population exposures, and exposure equity that may result from the roadway changes proposed, using a comprehensive modeling system. Second, we will perform a qualitative analysis on the health equity impacts of the program from a Health in all Policies decision-making perspective. Results will provide a case study for improving air pollution, health, and equity outcomes of large-scale metropolitan transportation infrastructure projects.
