Brief Description of Research Project	What happens when you give poor families a car? For decades, scholars have suggested that giving poor families cars can help them move up the economic ladder, yet these programs have rarely been studied. My research will study changes in poor families' lives when they receive a car from the largest vehicle donation program in the country. First, I will analyze existing survey data to assess the changes in employment, income, and travel. Second, I will interview the recipients of cars to learn how car ownership improves healthcare access, enables a richer social and civic life, and expands education opportunities.
