The WEIC Commission will continue to focus their time and energy into the implementation of their framework consisting of: **funding student success, consolidating governance, and meeting the needs of Wilmington students.**

To promote the continuous improvement of public education for all Delaware students, especially for schools with high concentrations of children living in poverty, English Language Learners and other students at risk, the Commission will prioritize the following:

- ▶ Statewide, equitable funding for low-income students, English language learners, and basic special education students K–3
- ▶ Request final approval from the legislature for the Commission’s redistricting plan
- ▶ Improve alignment of resources and programs to support student learning and development from birth through college and workforce
- ▶ Strengthen parent, educator, and community engagement and support, with schools as community assets
- ▶ Improve and sustain collaboration among all schools that serve Wilmington students

The Wilmington Education Improvement Commission is a 23-person group, mandated by law, to propose recommendations for an improved education system that benefits all students Statewide, specifically in Wilmington. The Commission is committed to **promoting a new vision of public education** and carry out the Action Agenda of the previous Wilmington Education Advisory Committee.
