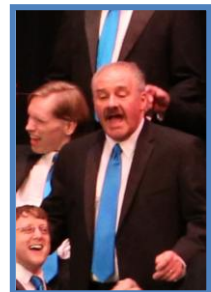

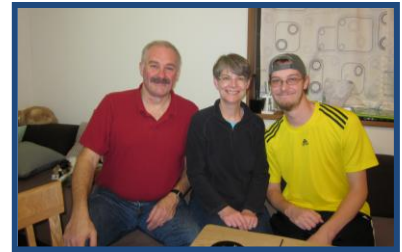


**MVEer asks:** Chuck, what other hobbies or interests do you have besides singing?
