Interview with New Member Brian Plehn

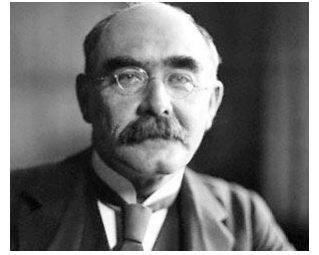


MVEer asks: Aside from barbershop singing, we'd like to know about what you do for a living and about some of your hobbies or interests.


IF you can keep your head when all about you
