Key Conclusions

The RSC is one component of HomeGrown StL's (HGStL's) Governance Structure. The RSC will

- establish long-term objectives to ensure systems change in the delivery of services to Black boys and young men in the region.
- provide expertise, input, feedback, and solution-based critique regarding issues, trends, capacity gaps, and policies effecting Black boys and young men.
- seek to collaborate with community partners with the potential for synergy in identifying and addressing the untreated issues facing Black boys and young men.

My Brother's Keeper is another mechanism with the HGStL's Governance that will serve to engage and present the voices of Black boys and young men, highlighting their experiences to direct HGStL and the RSC.

Action Items

- Narrow the focus and descriptions of the work group assignments, the 7-pillars, and the PPN to avoid overlap and overbroad interpretation of the work.
- Develop clear milestones and a timeline for completing the work.
- Provide a clear understanding of the Theory of Change model and HGStL's approaches in comparison to other MBK communities.
- Develop clear language and a visual representation as to how Black males are going to be engaged and participate involved within HGStL's Governance Structure.
