The Brown School offers various programs within Social Work (MSW), Public Health (MPH) and Social Policy (MSP) as well as Ph.D. programs in Social Work and Public Health Sciences.

Procedure for undergraduate students to apply for enrollment in Brown School MSW Program courses: Enrollment of students from other Schools or departments requires permission from the student's home school and the Brown School Registrar's Office. Please contact the Brown School Registrar for permission to enroll into Brown School courses. registraroffice@brownschool.wustl.edu. Students from other Schools must meet certain criteria in order to enroll in Brown School courses. Failure to comply with these requirements will result in the student being dropped from Brown School course/s. Enrollment is not guaranteed, and Brown School students are given priority.

Brown School Program courses are open to upperclass JR and SR students with prior approval from the student's home school, the Brown School Registrar's Office and on a case-by-case basis. Students can contact the Brown School Registrar, registraroffice@brownschool.wustl.edu after receiving permission from their home school.

Note: The audit grade option is **not** available for any Brown School courses. No more than two undergraduate students will be allowed to enroll in any course section.

Procedure for undergraduate students to apply for enrollment in a graduate-level Brown School course at Washington University in St. Louis: Approval for undergraduates in MSW or MPH courses will be based upon 1) available space after Brown School students have registered 2) approval of the Brown School Registrar and 3) undergraduate student's advisor and home school. Individual students may take no more than nine total credit hours of graduate-level Brown School courses as undergraduate students.

Enrollment in and successful completion of a graduate-level Brown School courses as an undergraduate student does NOT guarantee an undergraduate student admission into any programs offered by the Brown School at Washington University in St. Louis. If accepted into any program at the Brown School, courses completed as an undergraduate student will **not** fulfill requirements in a degree seeking program at the Brown School.
