launched the Ending the HIV Epidemic Plan in February 2019. The goal is to eliminate new HIV infections in the U.S. MCBAN is uniquely poised to move this plan into action through supporting states hardest hit by HIV, many of which are within the Midwest. MCBAN's mission is to enhance the infrastructure and support individual- and system-level changes within health departments and other community-based organizations to increase access to and utilization of HIV prevention services.

The Evaluation Center is implementing a process and outcome evaluation to monitor and assess the MCBAN efforts across the Midwest region. We are working closely with the MCBAN team to develop data tracking tools and systems, understand and communicate the effectiveness of the capacity-building activities, and implement continuous quality improvement efforts.

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## New Partnerships/ Projects

The Evaluation Center is excited to be partnering with [Dr. Patricia Kohl](#), Associate Professor at the Brown School, and [Vision for Children at Risk](#) (VCR) on an exciting new five- year grant with funding from Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration.

**St. Louis Project LAUNCH (STL-PL)** will promote the wellness of young children, from birth to 8 years of age, by addressing the social, emotional, cognitive, physical, and behavioral aspects of their development. From 2012 to 2018, VCR led the local implementation of a state-wide Project LAUNCH grant awarded to the Missouri Department of Mental Health. STL-PL will build on this project to expand the geographic impact from two ZIP codes to all 18 ZIP codes in St. Louis City.

The purpose of the evaluation is to demonstrate the effectiveness of STL-PL service delivery by assessing processes and outcomes, and assess the degree to which the project improved outcomes for providers, caregivers, and children.
