What we gathered

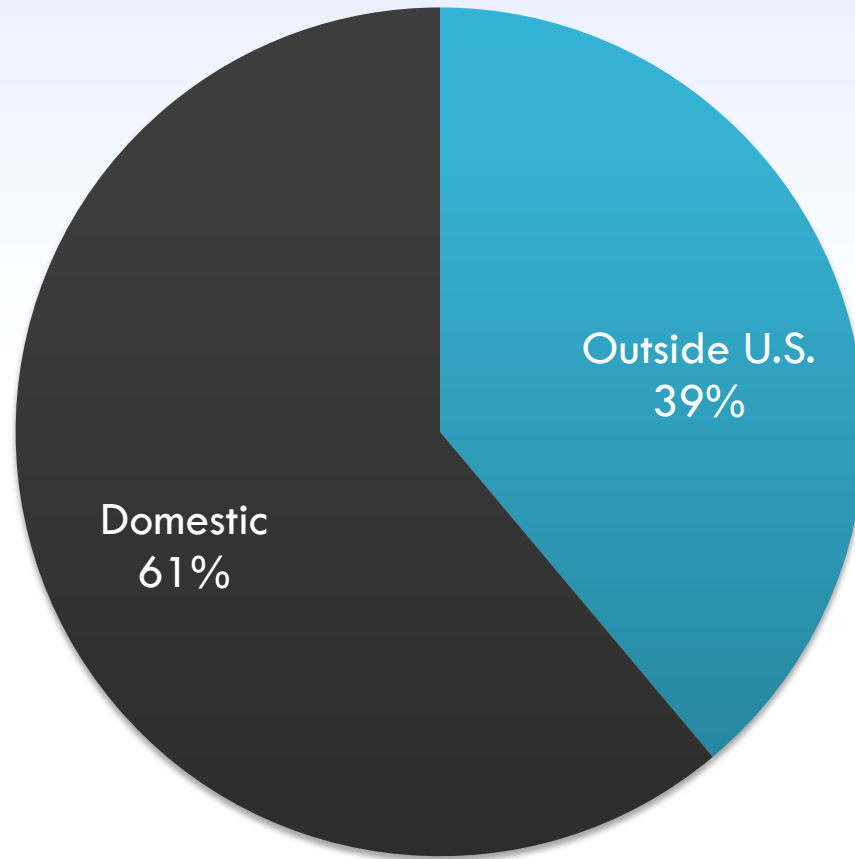
Methods

- Total of 18 courses identified

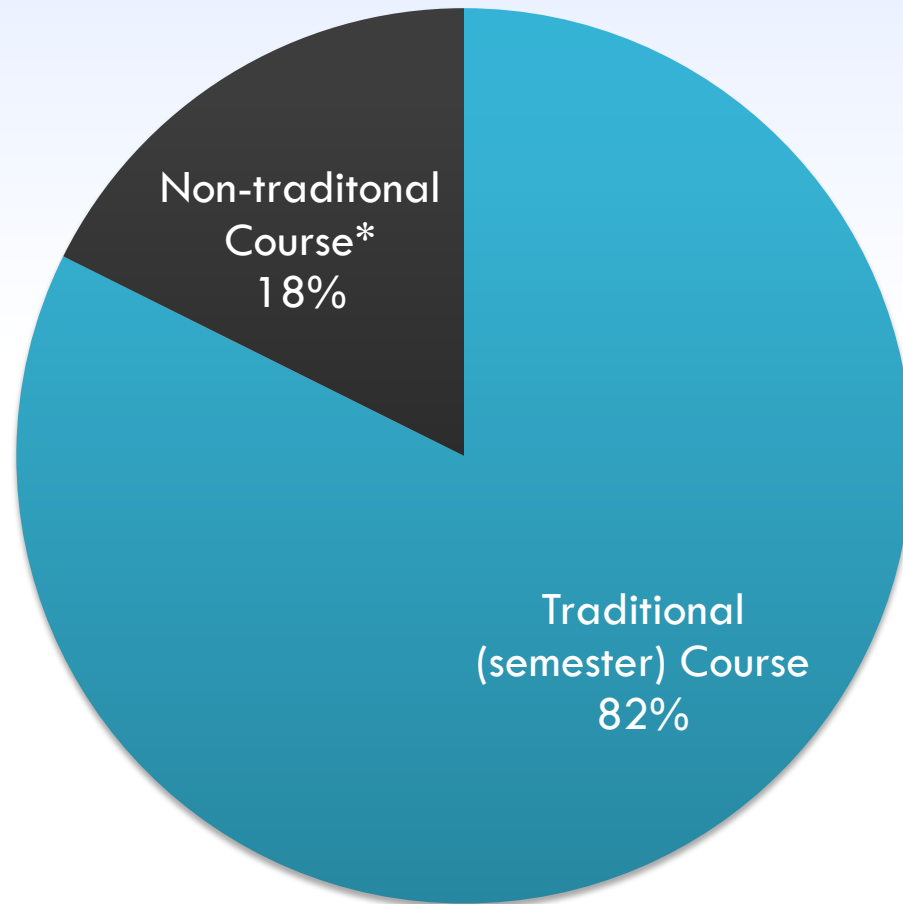
Dissemination/uses

- Excel document
 - Provides course and syllabi information of other D&I courses over the world
 - Varies in scope, audience, etc.
 - D&I (and its synonyms) are the unifying theme
- Can be used to inform and inspire your own syllabus development

Location

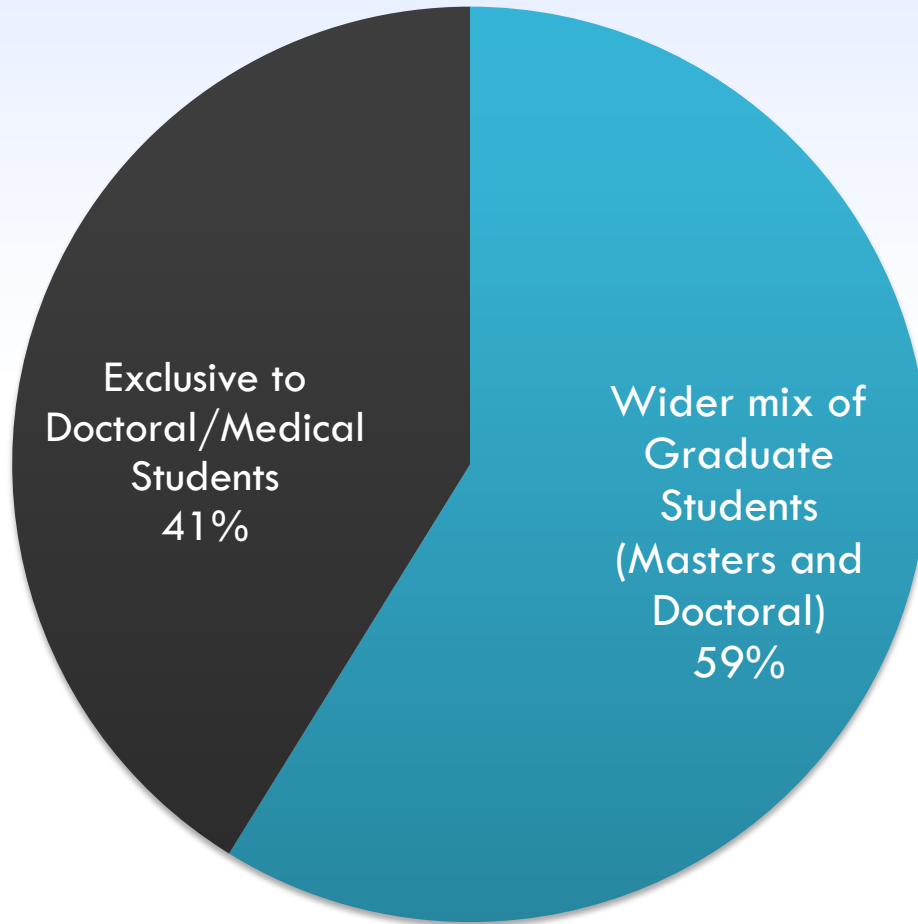


Type of Course
