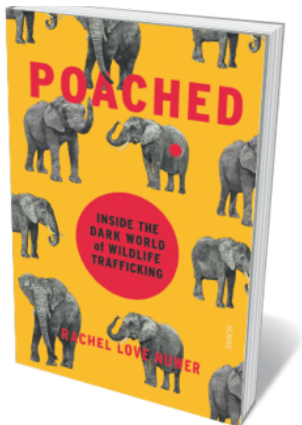


BEHIND THE SCENES OF *POACHED*: PUBLIC TALK BY SCIENCE JOURNALIST RACHEL NUWER

After nearly six years of investigating the underworld of illegal wildlife trafficking, Nuwer has published her first book, *Poached: Inside the Dark World of Wildlife Trafficking*, to widespread acclaim. Her work spans four continents and 12 countries to encompass the vast network of participants in the trade.
