### Johns Hopkins and Mayo Trained

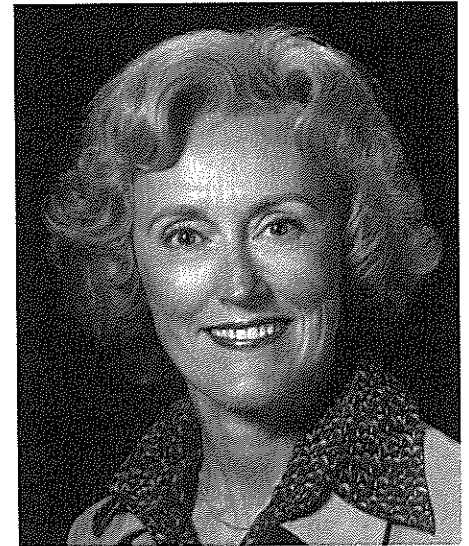
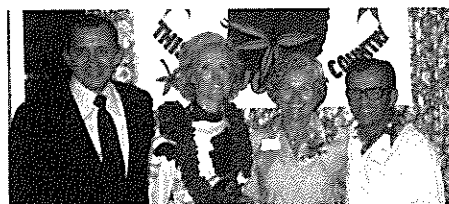

He completed two years of military service at the U.S. Naval Hospital, Oceanside, California, where he was Officer in Charge of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery.

Dr. Pavel is a member of the American Dental Association, Southern California Dental Association; is a past president of the San Diego County Dental Society. He served as president of the Southern California Society of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons in 1975-76 and has been active in the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, serving as chairman, Committee on Federal Oral Surgical Services 1970-71. Frank is a Fellow, American Dental Society of Anesthesiology; a Fellow, International Society of Oral Surgeons and is currently serving as President, Western Society of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons.

### American Board Service

Dr. Pavel is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral Surgery and has been honored with Fellowship in the American College of Dentists and in the International College of Dentists. He is also an Honorary Member — Colegio de Cirujanos Dentistas de Tijuana, B.C., Mexico. He is a Regional Consultant in Oral Surgery to the Council on Dental Education, American Dental Association. Many of our recent residents have met Dr. Pavel in conjunction with his service to the American Board of Oral Surgery where he has been a member of the Advisory Committee 1965-1974, a Regional Consultant, 1971-1973, and a member of the Board of Directors since 1975.

## Welcome, Marilyn R. Pavel

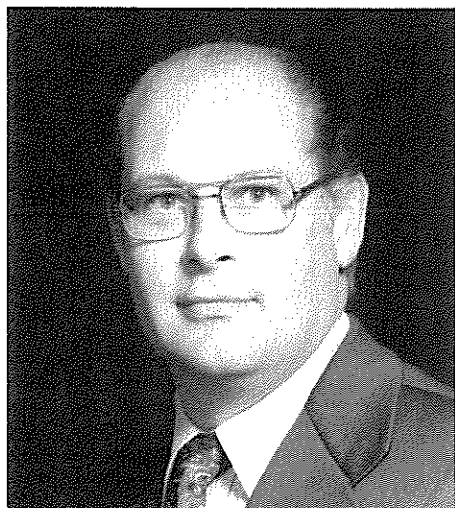

# HONORING . . .

WILLIAM R. WALLACE, D.D.S.



## PRESIDENT-ELECT AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF ORAL

If asked to select one individual who epitomizes the growth of OSU Oral Surgery over the past twenty five years, that person would most likely be Bill Wallace. From intern in oral surgery, 1959, to President of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, 1979, Bill's career reflects the development and achievement of OSU Oral Surgery over the past quarter century. Bill's commitment to our OSU Society, to the oral surgery residency program, to the OSU College of Dentistry, and to the profession of dentistry is largely responsible for the way we are today. We are pleased, in our twentyfifth year, to honor this man whose accomplishments so vividly portray OSU oral surgery.

Born in Warren, Ohio, (a New Year's Eve baby), and an early (January) graduate of Lakewood, Ohio High School, Bill completed the pre-dentistry curriculum at OSU in under six quarters and was accepted to dental school . . . a person with a goal, commitment, and the where-with-all to achieve. Bill received the D.D.S. degree in 1956 (with highest honors, OKU, Callahan Award). He served a year's rotating dental internship in the U.S. Public Health Service Hospital, San Francisco, followed by two years as a Lieutenant, USPHS, during which he contributed to their intern training program. Bill became an accomplished general dentist, and continues to view himself as first a dentist, then an oral surgeon.

Bill returned to OSU where he completed three years of residency training in oral surgery with classmates Bernie Poindexter and Dave Weaver . . . the class of 1962. Bill was Chief Administrative Resident in their last year. He received the M. Sc. degree that same year in the field of clinical pathology. Thereafter began his singularly remarkable career in dental education, research, oral surgery, and professional service.

As a Fellow sponsored by the National Institute of Health, Bill studied the effects of fluoride ion on plasma enzymes while teaching undergraduate and graduate students in the Department of Oral Surgery. By 1969 he had become Associate Professor of Oral Surgery and was appointed Assistant Dean for Graduate Education, Research, and Student Relations. In 1970 he was appointed Professor and Chairman of the Department of Oral Surgery succeeding Dr. Allison who was appointed Chief, Clinical Division of Dentistry, University Hospitals. In 1974, Bill was appointed Acting Dean of the college following Dr. John R. Wilson's retirement. He is currently Professor and Chairman of Oral Surgery and Assistant Dean for Hospital Affairs.

In addition to his college duties, Bill has fulfilled what he views as an obligation to serve the dental profession at all levels of involvement. A brief listing would include President of Psi Omega Fraternity, National Chapter; President of the Ohio Dental Society of Anesthesiology; President of American Dental Society of Anesthesiology; Member of the Board of Directors of the Columbus Dental Society; Chairman of several committees of the Ohio Dental Association; Consultant to the Council of Dental Education of the Ameri-

can Dental Association; Fellow of the American College of Dentists; Fellow of the International College of Dentists; Fellow in general anesthesia of the American Dental Society of Anesthesiology.

Bill has ably represented oral surgery locally, nationwide, and around the world. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral Surgery and has served on the Advisory Committee of the American Board. He is a member of the Ohio, Great Lakes, American and International Association of Oral Surgeons. He was a member of the Board of Trustees, served as Secretary-Treasurer, and was elected Vice-President of the American Society of Oral Surgeons in 1976. Later that year, Bill represented the AAOMS at the ISOS meeting in Australia, and visited major world capitals as our representative and goodwill ambassador. Last Year, Bill was elected President-Elect in San Francisco, the city where his post graduate dental career started, and he will be inaugurated as President of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons in Chicago this fall . . . the highlight of a career filled with notable achievement.

We are pleased to honor this man, Bill Wallace, who has brought so much honor to us.

(or whatever)

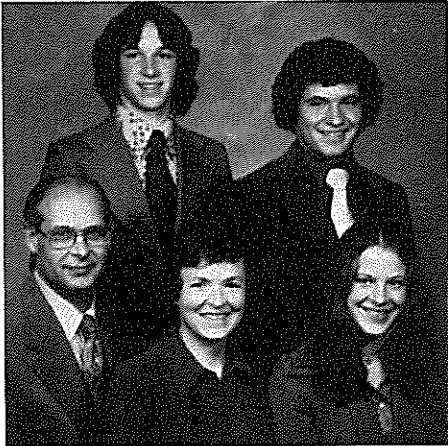

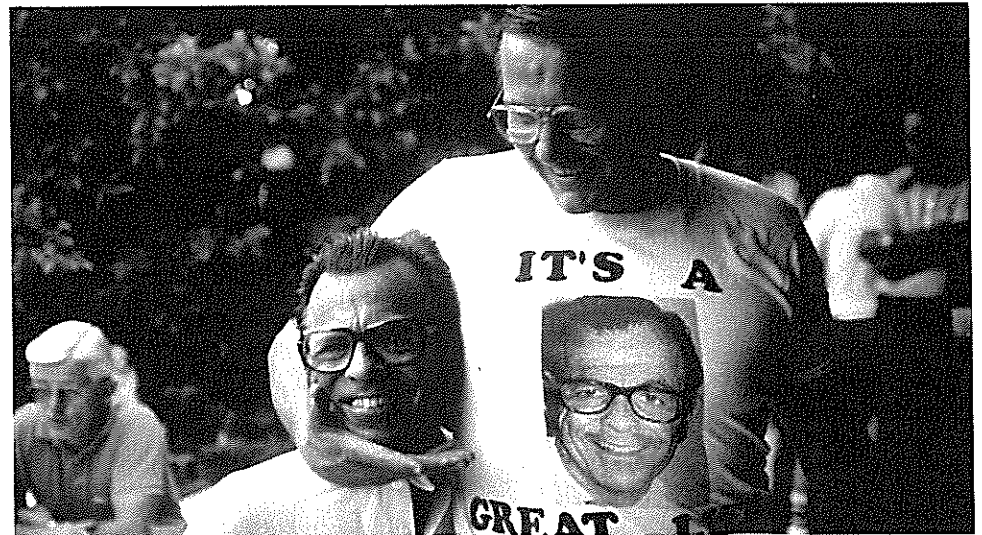

### IN THE NEWS . . .

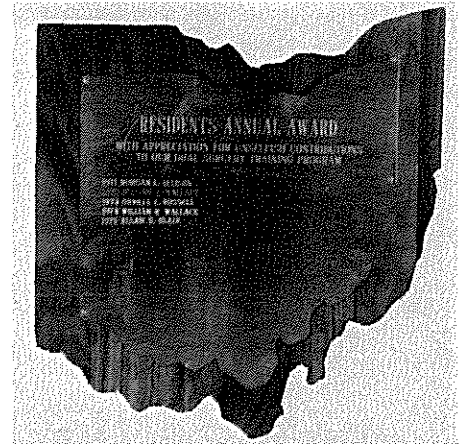

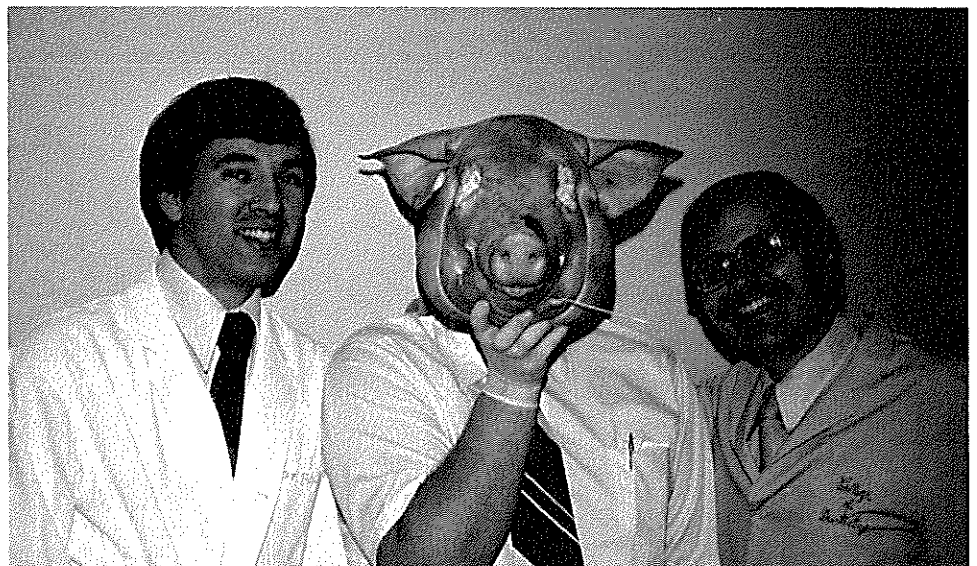


## RESIDENTS ANNUAL AWARD, 1977

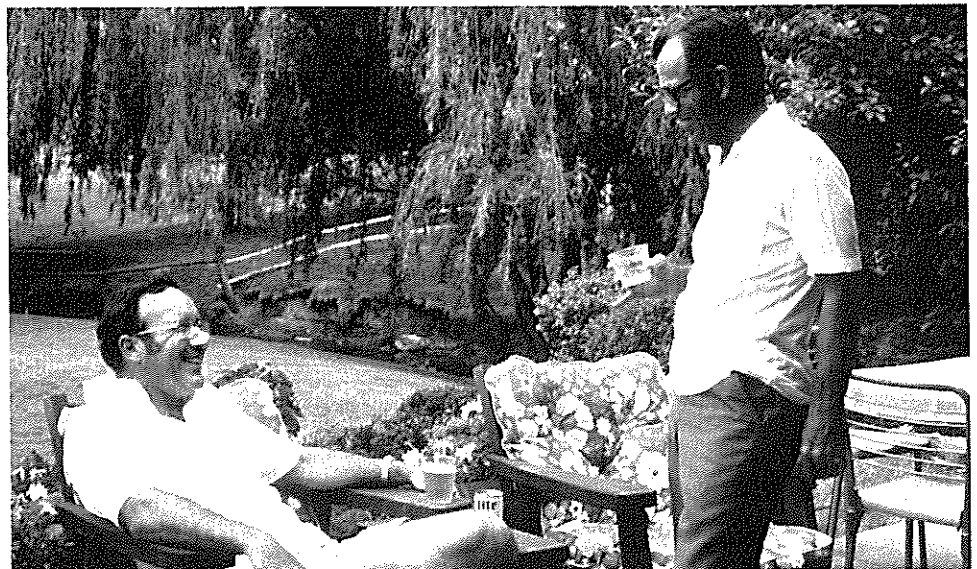

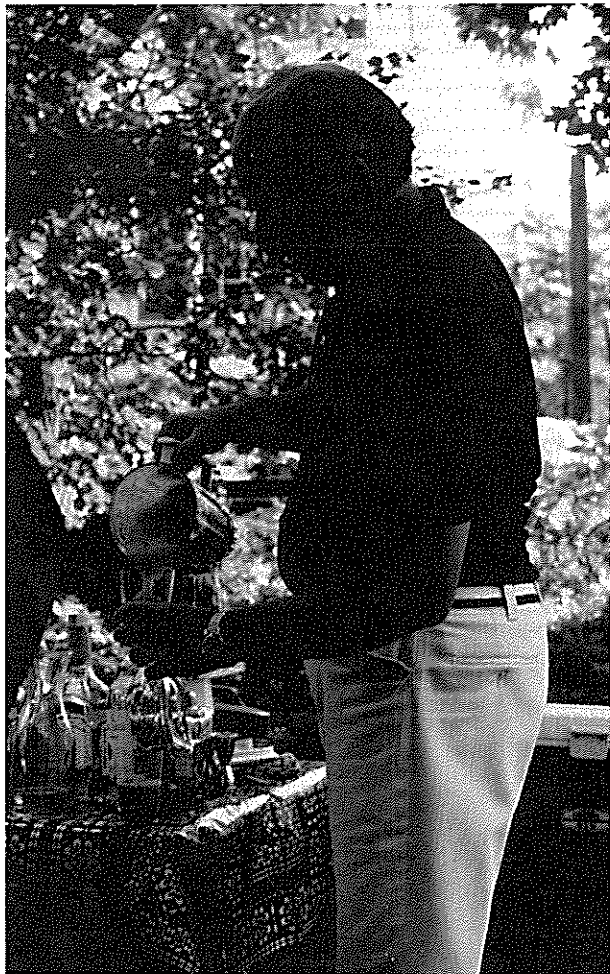

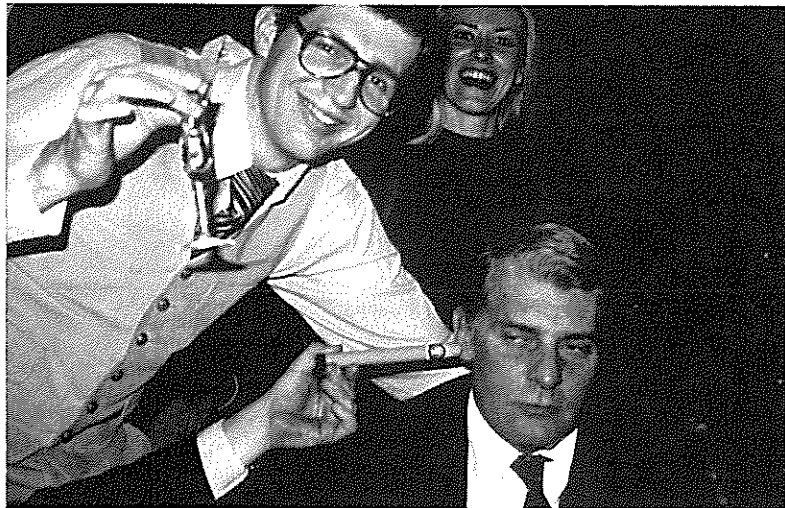

 He knows both careers and his ego can take it.

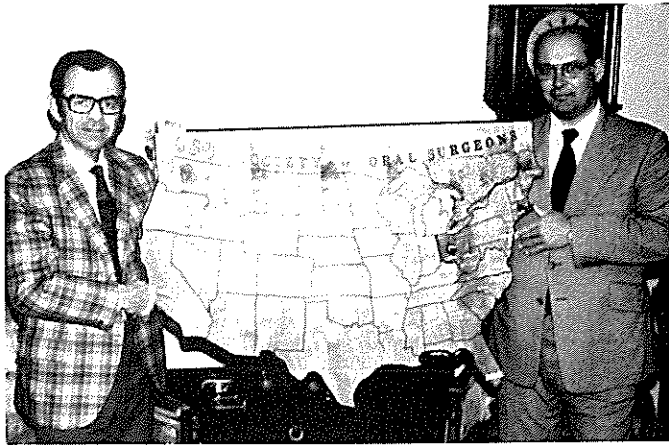
Roger's our strong supporter, Presidents Club and all that

### Tiradentes—Brazilian Hero



Joaquim Jose de d'Sylva, Tiradentes, a tooth puller, was liberator of minorities in Brazil 1871. Tiradentes and other conspirators through political action forced the end of slavery and brought about emancipation for blacks, Indians, and all others in Brazil. Tiradentes is venerated in Brazil as President Lincoln is in these United States. The Brazilian government honored him in 1928 with his photo and the inscription *Tiradentes* engraved on their 5000 Cruzeiro legal currency.
