

The CRAAP Test Worksheet

Use the following list to help you evaluate sources. Answer the questions as appropriate, and then rank each of the 5 parts from 1 to 10 (1 = unreliable, 10 = excellent). Add up the scores to give you an idea of whether you should use the resource (and whether your professor would want you to!).

Currency: the timeliness of the information.....

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- When was the information published or posted? January 30th, 2018
- Has the information been revised or updated? yes
- Is the information current or out-of-date for your topic? Current
- Are the links functional? yes

Relevance: the importance of the information for your needs.....

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- Does the information relate to your topic or answer your question? yes
- Who is the intended audience? People with one hand / know someone with one hand
- Is the information at an appropriate level? yes
- Have you looked at a variety of sources before choosing this one? yes
- Would you be comfortable using this source for a research paper? yes

Authority: the source of the information.....

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- Who is the author/publisher/source/sponsor? Ryan Hagan
- Are the author's credentials or organizational affiliations given? "The Mighty Contributor"
- What are the author's credentials or organizational affiliations given? He only has one arm...
- What are the author's qualifications to write on the topic? He only has one arm
- Is there contact information, such as a publisher or e-mail address? yes
- Does the URL reveal anything about the author or source? NO

Accuracy: the reliability, truthfulness, and correctness of the content.....

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- Where does the information come from? The Author and everyday people
- Is the information supported by evidence? yes
- Has the information been reviewed or refereed? NOT sure
- Can you verify any of the information in another source? yes
- Does the language or tone seem biased and free of emotion? NO
- Are there spelling, grammar, or other typographical errors? No

Purpose: the reason the information exists.....

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- What is the purpose of the information? Informational/ helpful
- Do the authors/sponsors make their intentions or purpose clear? yes
- Is the information fact? opinion? propaganda? Little bit of both fact and opinion
- Does the point of view appear objective and impartial? yes
- Are there political, ideological, cultural, religious, institutional, or personal biases? No
