What is Metabesity?



What abstract topics will be accepted?

The committee encourages submissions that are innovative and challenge current treatment paradigms. Topics (as they relate to the theme of metabesity) include, but are not limited to:

- Aging
- Cancer
- Cardiovascular disease
- Diabetes
- Neurodegenerative disease
- Obesity
- Approaches to target metabesity, including drugs, devices, digital technology, nutrition, and lifestyle intervention

How will accepted abstracts be featured?

Accepted abstracts of researchers who register for the conference will be published on the conference website. Presenters will receive space to display a poster, and conference goers will view posters during breaks in the official proceedings, such as during lunches on Day 1 and Day 2 of the conference. Top abstracts will be recognized from the podium in a plenary session.

What is the timeline for application and acceptance?

There is an early deadline (June 1, 2019, 5 p.m. EDT) and a standard deadline (August 1, 2019, at 5 p.m. EDT).

Note: There is a limited number of abstracts that can be accepted for poster presentation due to spatial constraints in the conference venue. Poster slots will be offered on a rolling basis, so interested parties are encouraged to submit their abstracts early and take advantage of discounted rates for Early Bird registration.
