

Ohio Master Gardener Volunteer Program

OSU Extension is pleased to announce an upcoming *Master Gardener Volunteer Training* program for area clientele. The classes will be offered during the day from 9:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. on Tuesday's starting October 3rd and running through December 5th (10 sessions offered, you must attend 9 to obtain the 50 hours of training required). The sessions will be held at OSU Extension, Clermont County in Owensville, OH.

Class dates are subject to change due to speaker, tour or location conflicts.

After completing the program and final exam, individuals will be required to volunteer a minimum of 50 hours and complete 10 hours of advanced educational training to become a *Master Gardener Volunteer*. These individuals volunteer their time assisting with educational programs and activities for area residents through OSU Extension. Volunteer hours can be completed in your county of residence or where you hold membership.

An application, references, background check and fingerprinting are required for all OSU Volunteers. This must be completed by the first class of the *Master Gardener Volunteer* training.

A short interview to discuss your interest in becoming a *Master Gardener Volunteer* is also required and will be set up once class enrollment is in place.

The cost for the entire course is \$250.00 per person if registered on or before September 12, 2017. Registrations received after September 12, 2017, will be \$275.00. Once trained, if you complete the 50 hours of volunteer time by December 31, 2018, \$100 will be refunded.
