## **I. EXPERIENCES IN 4-H PROJECT ACTIVITIES - 30 POINTS**

### **A. Size and scope - 10 POINTS**

Size - anything that can be expressed in quantity, number of acres, pounds, animals, dollars, yards, meals, dresses, outfits, hours, bushels, people reached, etc.

Scope - range, variety, growth, increases

### **B. Learning Experiences - 10 Points**

Any experiences the member could have learned (from clinics, workshops, demonstrations, classes, books read, exhibitions, conferences, field trips, lectures, etc.)

### **C. Knowledge and Skills - 10 Points**

Knowledge and skills gained -- this information must be derived from successes in grades, competition, awards, trophies, placings, difficulty and size of project completed, level of competition or exhibit, etc.

## **II. 4-H LEADERSHIP EXPERIENCES - 45 POINTS** - Experiences where the member directed, planned, organized, conducted, and taught as compared to attended, participated or helped.

### **A. 4-H Volunteer Leadership - 25 Points**

Teaching, leading, directing, planning, organizing, conducting, assisting at workshops, clinics, camps, retreats, judging, tours, field trips, fairs, etc.

### **B. 4-H Elected/Appointed Leadership - 10 Points**

Any leadership responsibility performed because you were elected, selected, appointed to serve in a specific capacity - club officers, committee chairpersons, boards, councils, etc.

### **C. 4-H Promotional Leadership - 10 Points**

Any promotional leadership experience where you wrote scripts, gave speeches, coordinated schedules, wrote thank you's, visited civic groups and businesses to promote 4-H, etc.

## **III. CITIZENSHIP/COMMUNITY SERVICE - 25 POINTS**

**CITIZENSHIP** - helping, assisting, or leading with informed concern on behalf of self or others as an individual or group action.

**COMMUNITY SERVICE** - helping, assisting, or leading as an individual or with others to help your community; the benefit of others.

**A. 4-H Project Citizenship/Community Service - 10 Points** - 4-H project related activities where members assisted, helped. Performed or gave leadership to a positive experience for other people that related to the 4-H project.

**B. Other Citizenship/Community Service - 10 Points** - Citizenship and community service activities where members helped. Assisted, performed or gave leadership to a positive experience for other people that did not relate directly to a specific project.

**C. Non 4-H Citizenship/Community Service - 5 Points** - Meaningful citizenship/community service activities in school, church, or other community organizations other than 4-H.
