He is the author of the widely acclaimed book <u>High Price: A Neuroscientist's Journey of Self-Discovery That Challenges Everything You Know About Drugs and Society</u>, for which he won the E.O. Wilson Literary Science Writing Award in 2014. He is an outspoken critic of current theories and policies om drug abuse, and has spoken on myths about drug addictions at a <u>TEDMED</u> event. He is featured in the documentary <u>The House I Live In (2012 film)</u>, and has given testimony to the United States Congress' Committee On Oversight and Government Reform.
