






## Recreational Corridor

Several considerations were taken when designing the recreational corridor. First, according to our sponsor, Hudson McComb, the pool should remain unchanged where it is, as there is a good chance it would not be rebuilt if constructed over. We also tried to keep the playground nearby the picnic areas so it would be easier for parents to keep an eye on their children while staying in the same general area. Because the playgrounds available to the general public were located farther away from the school and are not fenced, the schools were given their own separate playgrounds, fenced in so teachers could watch over and feel safe about not losing children. The horses were kept along the road as their appearance is aesthetically pleasing to tourists or other people walking around the village. The amphitheater's location was kept closer to the commercial locations where there would be more people, but its location was also based off where it fit best in relation to where other aspects of the recreational corridor should be placed.

Several sketches were made in planning the placement for various parts of the recreational corridor, and can be seen below:





General thoughts:

- The pool should stay where it is, otherwise it may not be rebuilt
- Tried to keep play/rec area near braai/picnic areas, so parents could keep an eye on their kids while in the same general area
- Attempted to keep horses along the road, people going through the village may like the aesthetic appeal of seeing animals as they walk by
- Amphitheater should stay near more commercial locations but could go anywhere
- School needs own separate play area so they don't have to travel too far and it can be fenced in as part of the school so teachers don't have to worry about losing children
