## Reblocking Resources for Flamingo Crescent

***Abstract: These resources were created to help the City of Cape Town and the Flamingo Crescent community to renumber each house and give names to each street. This provided every resident with an official address that could be easily identifiable by postal services. The first document includes different tables grouping houses based on their respective streets. In addition, the old house number and new house number are listed next to each other to allow for an easy comparison. The second document is a color coded map that shows every street and house in Flamingo Crescent.***


