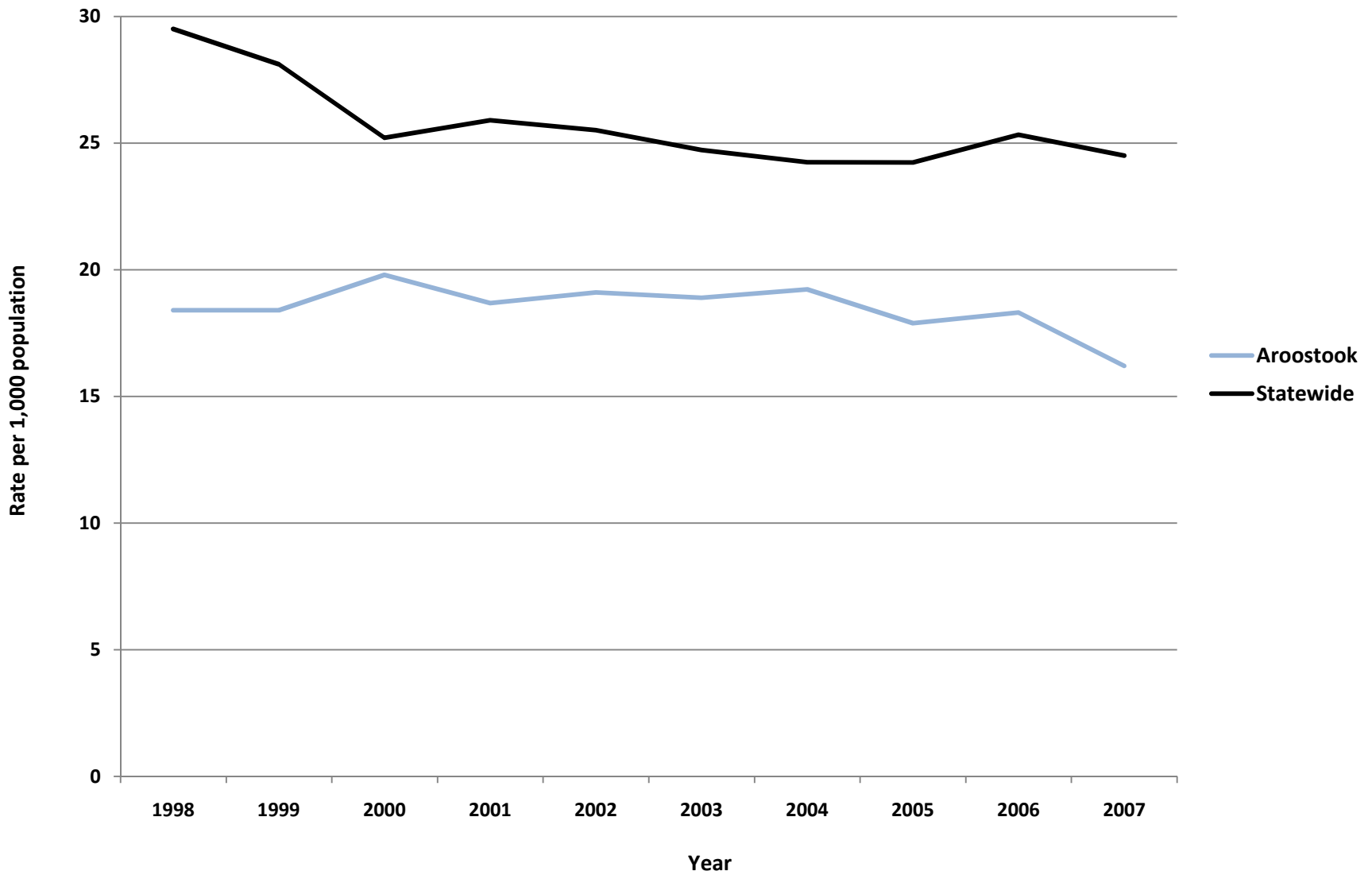
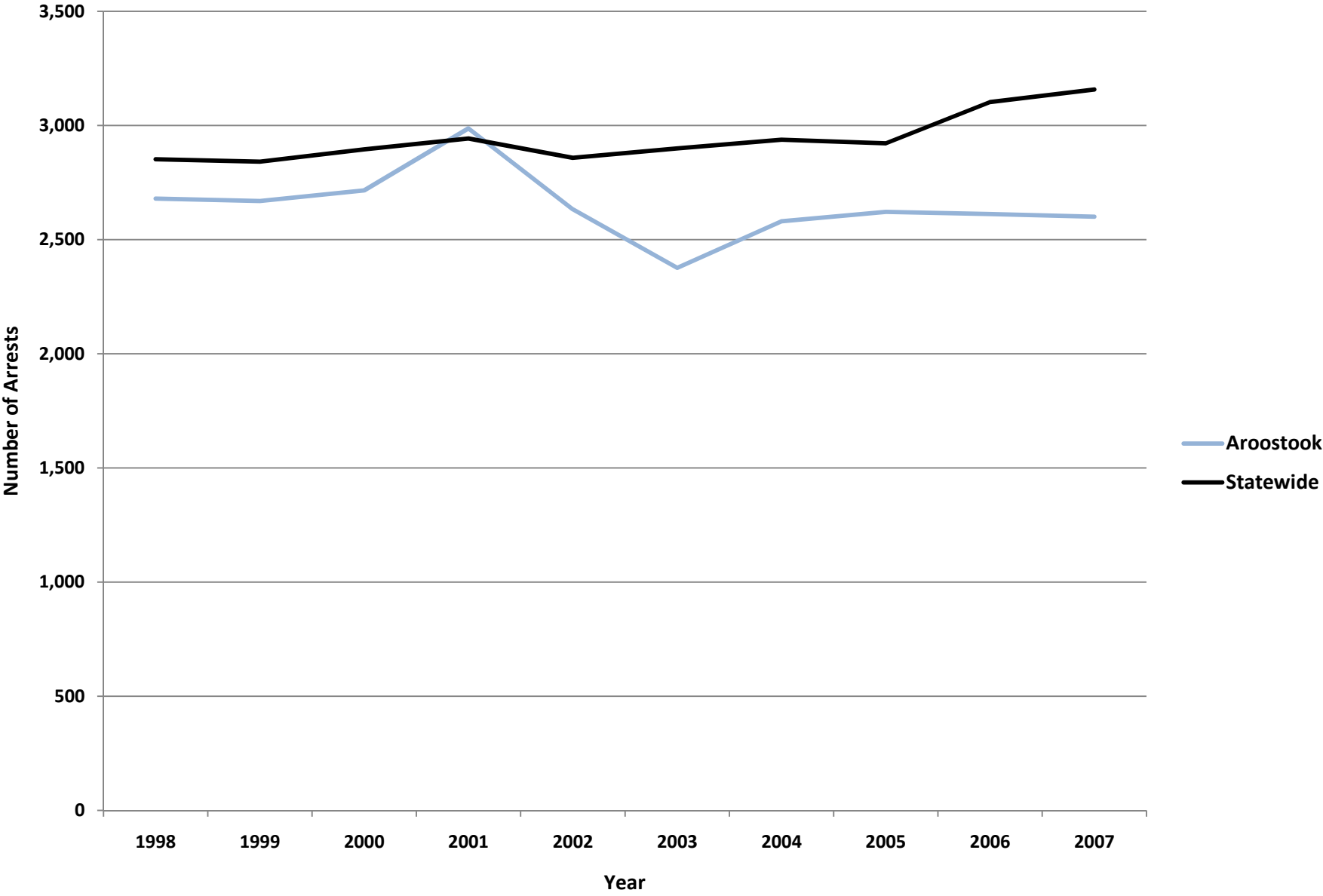


Aroostook - Property Crimes per 1,000 Residents (Total Population)
