Welcome New Members!

CASSEY: I am currently attending Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary school as an 8th grader. I will graduate this June. I began my Journey to God when I enrolled into a Catholic school and a Parish that showed me the importance of faith. I discovered the RCIA program a few months ago, and it changed my life drastically. It educated me on the life of Jesus, and real life situations of faith. I started the RCIA program at my school's parish and I am now a new member of the church after receiving the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. I joined this program because I really want to be closer to God. I really felt the calling to be fully initiated into the Catholic Church. I have really enjoyed every aspect of the program; the classes, the discussions, the trip to the Cathedral, the practice and the reception of the three sacraments on the 2022 Easter Vigil. In all, I enjoyed every single bit of my journey and I can't wait for what awaits me in the future with my faith.

SUSAN ELIZABETH ROSETT: I joined the RCIA program in this parish as far back as October 2020. I became a Catechumen in December with the Rite of Acceptance. I was fully initiated into the Catholic faith on Saturday April 16. I received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist during this year's Easter Vigil. After getting engaged to my fiancé, Joseph, I felt it was important that I go on a faith journey and become a Catholic so that we can share the same faith in our marriage and our lives. Joseph found Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish, and after attending our first Mass lead by Father Mike, we knew we wanted to join this church community and go through the RCIA program. I hope to

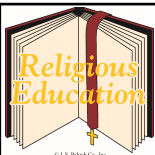
continue to grow in my faith after my Baptism and to strengthen my relationship with God by studying the Bible, and getting more involved in the church community.

He had asked me if I would like to complete the process of initiation into the Catholic Church with him at ABVM. I agreed. I joined the program to complete my initiation process by receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation as I thought it was long overdue, but also to strengthen my relationship with God, as well as to have a better understanding of God. I needed to incorporate God more fully into my life. As we came to the end of the program, I realized that I had learned many things. Although I was Baptized, there are so many things I did not know about the Church. One of the very first things I learned when starting the RCIA program was how the structure of ABVM was strategically built to show the connection to God and the parishioners, and how everything in the Church is focused on the cross, the altar and the Tabernacle. Another important lesson I learned from the RCIA program is to never read the Bible literally, but to analyze the text in depth, and to look at the hidden meanings behind each story. Each story has a hidden moral lesson waiting to be discovered.

I am so happy that I was able to be a part of the RCIA program and meet other wonderful RCIA candidates, to be under the guidance of Father Mike, having our three major Scrutinies and dismissal led by the Williams', and to be in the presence of such a wonderful and welcoming church community at ABVM. I felt that throughout this entire journey in RCIA, I was able to build a stronger connection with God and I am so thankful for this experience and everything I was able to learn.

JOSEF ANDREW PILLAR DE GUZMAN: I was a Catechumen in ABVM's RCIA program in 2022. I received my First Communion and the Sacrament of Confirmation during this year's Easter Vigil. I first discovered the RCIA program through ABVM's Young Adult Ministry (YAM). Later, I emailed the parish for more information. I wanted to learn more about the Church and renew my connection with God, the faith, and the community. Then, I decided to register for the RCIA program with my younger sister, Camille. Throughout the program, I continued to learn and strengthen my faith and hope in God. I hope to continue to grow with the community and with God, and to look forward to the path God has for me.

IAN FRASIER McFEAT: I am excited to join the Catholic community of Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. My wife's family are all strong members of the Catholic Church. My own father's Catholic upbringing attracted me to the faith. I am from the Pacific Northwest and have been an educator for twenty-two years in both the private and public sectors. 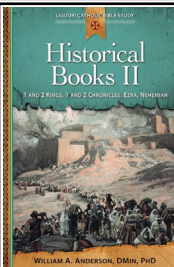

In honor of Mother's Day, the Knights of Columbus will distribute flowers on Mother's Day, May 8.

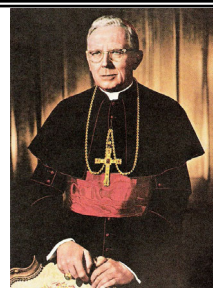

The tradition of honoring Mary during May is a longstanding one, perhaps originating in the 13th Century. In his 1965 encyclical *Mense Maio*, Pope Paul VI identified the month of May as an opportune time to incorporate special prayers for peace into traditional May devotions.



Four Reasons to Honor Mary During May

1. **Mary is Jesus' mother.**
She is the instrument of the Incarnation and her yes, or fiat, made it possible for our Lord to come into the world.
2. **She is the first and most perfect disciple.**
Mary was the first to hear the Good News, and the first to follow Christ. Her entire life was devoted to him and assisting him, in whatever way she could, to carry on his mission. Unaffected by Original Sin, she was able to perfectly open herself to God's will.
3. **She is our mom.**
She's our mother because we are all members of the Body of Christ. At the moment she gave her fiat, she became our mother.
4. **Mary is advocate, helper, benefactress and mediator.**
As the first and most perfect disciple, she is devoted to accompanying Him and continuing her saving office by interceding for us.

"Stringing In The Rain"

It was late. Our Conference meeting was long and vocal as usual. The agenda for the evening was long. The meeting took forever. I drove to the pizzeria on Colorado Blvd., as I like to do after a big meeting in order to decompress. It is always good to be out of the house after having spent most of the day at my desk. I ordered a glass of Merlot and sat by the neon lit window. I slowly drank the wine and slowly felt the weight on my shoulders and neck lifted. What a great meeting, I thought. Let this night end, I sighed.

Almost never without incident, I left the eatery and turned left and walked down the esplanade between Vroman's and the Playhouse 7. Usually the homeless seek refuge there for the night, but the benches were devoid of sleepers. Then I saw a young man on the stage at the end of the esplanade. He was young, with black hair and wearing army pants and a vest. He was sitting there atop the brick stage with his traveling wares surrounding him. He was stringing his box guitar.

I immediately thought of my son... who is in the Army. I was struck with a sense of sadness. Why the difference between the two young men? One working at a career, the other homeless.

I introduced myself and he wrote down SSVdP on a piece of paper. "That's your group, he asked?" "I'd like to start my own group one day... I know a lot about the homeless here in Pasadena... we need help... this is cool." I was stymied by the sight of this articulate, dirty-filthy, kind, grunged-out, jovial and spirited man. "What's your name?" I asked. "Sam... nicknamed Liberty," he said. Sam shared with me the geography of homelessness in the city, from Filmore to Lake, down Colorado, bus and train stations, CVS open 24hrs, eastside vs. westside and Suicide Bridge. "I can help you with your work... take my email... it's old school but it works!" Sam said. I discussed shelters. Sam told me they were not for him. He lives free in the woods coming into town off and on.

"Do you have an E-string?," Sam asked me. The dark night began to drizzle. Sam sat peaceably stringing his guitar in the rain. I pulled an umbrella from my satchel and gave it to him in hopes it would shield his guitar. He told me he was grateful.

I strolled across the wet parking lot lit brightly by the fluorescent lights from the Target store. I feel good, but sad. The rain cools my head and clears the streets of people. Everyone except Sam.
